A Resolution Updating the 2016-2020 Spending Plan

This resolution is made in view of the following facts:

- 1. Per Article XXVII (6)(2)(e) the board shall determine what portion of moneys allocated to the trust fund shall remain in an interest-bearing account; and
- 2. The GOCO Board has adopted and duly considered the policy 2.10 *Mutiyear and Annual Spending Plans* which details all factors that must be considered regarding board authorized spending;
- In June 2019, the board approved Resolution #2019-09 to award funds to CPW for certain capital projects in the amount of \$3.9 million for outdoor recreation and \$300,000 for wildlife. Also, Resolution #2019-11 was approved to award wildlife funds of \$373,000 for a shooting range program.
- 4. On September 10, 2019, the Finance Committees recommended this amendment be forwarded to the full board for action.

Accordingly, the board RESOLVES:

- 1. Decrease the FY 2020 spending plan and increase the FY 2019 spending plan retroactively, as follows:
 - \$3,942,000 in the Outdoor Recreation category should be transferred from FY 2020 to FY 2019;
 - b. \$673,000 in the Wildlife category should be transferred from FY 2020 to FY 2019.

A Resolution Awarding Grants to Connect Initiative Projects

This resolution is made in view of the following facts:

- 1. GOCO staff evaluated six Connect Initiative applications requesting a total of \$12,032,980.
- 2. The board's spending plan for fiscal year 2020 allocated up to \$8,500,000 for the Connect Initiative.
- 3. On September 10, 2019, the Programs Committee forwarded the staff's recommendation to award a total of \$8,500,000 to fully fund to the three top-ranking projects and to split the remaining funds between the next two projects which tied for fourth.

Accordingly, the Board RESOLVES to:

- Award \$8,500,000 to fully fund top three recommended projects and partially fund the next two projects that tied for fourth, as identified in the attached "Connect Initiative Summary List – Projects Recommended for Funding". Finance these awards with an allocation of \$8,500,000 from the local government purpose.
- 2. Authorize the executive director to make minor adjustments in recommended funding levels if a project cannot proceed as anticipated. In the event significant funding changes are necessary as these projects progress, the executive director will consult with the board for further direction.

Consistent with the board's procedure on overdue grants, staff sent reminder notices to grantees with approaching due dates. Subsequent communications with grantees led staff to make the following recommendations.

Open Space Grant

#15381 Redwing Ranch - \$382,700.00

On June 18, 2015, the board awarded \$382,700.00 in open space purpose funds to San Isabel Land Protection Trust (SILPT) to acquire a conservation easement on 1,665 acres of the Redwing Ranch. The original completion date for the project was December 18, 2016. SILPT received a staff extension through March 23, 2017 and two board extensions, one through December 31, 2018 and the second through June 30, 2019. As evident by the number of extensions, the project has faced numerous challenges. The first two extensions were due to challenges in securing matching funds for the project. Once funding was secured, SILPT requested additional time to work through the project due diligence and transaction details. SILPT intended to close the transaction by the June 30, 2019 deadline but encountered additional roadblocks. The title company requested a revision to the legal description which prompted the need for a survey and the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) continues to delay closings with their extended due diligence review times and internal processes.

A considerable amount of time and effort has gone into this transaction and GOCO has reviewed and approved all project due diligence. The NRCS is currently reviewing the project due diligence and has granted a project extension through July 1, 2020. SILPT is extremely motivated to close the transaction and they see no reason why the transaction should not close by the end of 2019. Given the NRCS project extension and their extensive and cumbersome review, SILPT is requesting a third board extension through July 1, 2020 to follow with the NRCS' permitted timeline. Again, SILPT's goal is to complete the project by the end of 2019 but given the nature of the transaction and out of an abundance of caution they are requesting a board extension through July 1, 2020.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approval of extension request with the following conditions:

• The transaction will be completed no later than July 1, 2020.



• If the project is not closed by its extension date deadline, funds allocated to it may be automatically deauthorized with no further action by the board being necessary.

Local Parks and Outdoors Recreation Grant

#17017 South Park Baseball & Soccer Fields – \$350,000.00

On March 23, 2017, the board awarded \$350,000.00 in local government purpose funds to South Park Park and Recreation District to construct regulation baseball and soccer fields, building off GOCO land acquisition and planning dollars previously awarded. The original completion date for the project was March 23, 2019. The recreation district received a staff extension through September 27, 2019 as heavy winter snowfall delayed site preparation. To-date the recreation district is still working through site preparation after deciding to switch contractors. They anticipate hardscaping to begin in early 2020 with an early fall project completion. As such, South Park Park and Recreation District is requesting a board extension through December 31, 2020 to complete the project and submit final reporting.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approval of extension request with the following conditions:

- Complete the project and submit the final report to GOCO by December 31, 2020.
- If the project is not closed by its extension date deadline, funds allocated to it may be automatically deauthorized with no further action by the board being necessary.

#17054 Westminster Station Park Phase I – \$350,000.00

On March 23, 2017, the board awarded \$350,000.00 in local government purpose funds to the City of Westminster to construct Phase I of Station Park, an eventual 33-acre park adjacent to the newly opened Westminster Station along the RTD B-Line with connections to the Little Dry Creek Trail. The original completion date for the project was March 23, 2019. The city received a staff extension through September 27, 2019 as there were delays in raising additional dollars towards the project and the city needed more time to work with Adams County to annex a portion of the property to the city. To-date the city has met its fundraising goal, completed the annexation process, and is now working towards finalizing designs and project bidding. They anticipate construction to begin in early 2020 with a fall completion. As such, the City of Westminster is requesting a board extension through December 31, 2020 to complete the project and submit final reporting.

Recommendation: Approval of extension request with the following conditions:

- Complete the project and submit the final report to GOCO by December 31, 2020.
- If the project is not closed by its extension date deadline, funds allocated to it may be automatically deauthorized with no further action by the board being necessary.



#17061 CharMar Park Renovation - \$319,760.00

On March 23, 2017 the board awarded \$319,760.00 in local government purpose funds to the City of Gunnison for improvements at CharMar Park, a neighborhood park in the north end of the city. The original completion date for the project was March 23, 2019. The city received a staff extension through September 27, 2019 to allow additional time to go out for bid on a couple outstanding scope items – the picnic pavilion and park storage shed. To-date the city continues to have trouble securing a contractor for these projects but notes they're in a good position now to lay concrete and are committed to erect the shelters in-house if needed. As such, the City of Gunnison is requesting a board extension through March 31, 2020 to complete final scope elements and submit final reporting.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approval of extension request with the following conditions:

- Complete the project and submit the final report to GOCO by March 31, 2020.
- If the project is not closed by its extension date deadline, funds allocated to it may be automatically deauthorized with no further action by the board being necessary.

<u>Mini Grant</u>

#17308 Surface Creek Trail Improvement, Connection, and Extension Phase I – \$28,000.00

On March 23, 2017, the board awarded \$28,000.00 in local government purpose funds to the Town of Cedaredge for improvements on the Surface Creek Trial, a heavily accessed pedestrian trail in the center of town. The original completion date for the project was March 23, 2019. The town received a staff extension through September 27, 2019 as there were delays in the local HOA conveying land over to the town. It wasn't until April 2019 that much of the planned improvements could begin. To-date the town has completed 30% of the project and has bids secured for the ladder scope of work. The project is slated to be complete by end of year. As such, the Town of Cedaredge is requesting a board extension through March 31, 2020 to complete the project and submit final reporting.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approval of extension request with the following conditions:

- Complete the project and submit the final report to GOCO by March 31, 2020.
- If the project is not closed by its extension date deadline, funds allocated to it may be automatically deauthorized with no further action by the board being necessary.

Planning Grant

#17380 Colorado River Access and Recreation Improvement Planning – \$75,000.00

On March 23, 2017, the board awarded \$75,000.00 in local government purpose funds to the Town of Parachute to explore recreation opportunities in and along the Colorado River, an



untapped community asset and possible future economic driver. The original completion date for the project was March 23, 2019. The town decided to switch engineering firms midway which resulted in mobilization delays. Staff accommodated this change by approving a staff extension through September 27, 2019. To-date the town has a new firm on board, but heavy snow and rains have kept the river high and rapid longer than normal, delaying the collection of key wetland impact data. The project is now slated to be complete by July 2020. As such, the Town of Parachute is requesting a board extension through September 30, 2020 to complete the project and submit final reporting.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approval of extension request with the following conditions:

- Complete the project and submit the final report to GOCO by September 30, 2020.
- If the project is not closed by its extension date deadline, funds allocated to it may be automatically deauthorized with no further action by the board being necessary.

School Yard Initiative Grant

#17451 Edison Park at Venetian Village – \$110,000.00

On March 23, 2017 the board awarded \$110,000.00 in local government purpose funds to the City of Colorado Springs in partnership with Thomas Edison Elementary for improvements on its 60-year-old playground. The original completion date for Phase I of the project was March 23, 2019. The city received a staff extension through September 27, 2019 to incorporate Phase II of the project after a Colorado Health Foundation grant was secured. To-date the project is 98% complete with a single concrete element slated to be poured this fall. As such, the City of Colorado Springs is requesting a board extension through March 30, 2020 to complete the project and submit final reporting.

<u>Recommendation</u>: Approval of extension request with the following conditions:

- Complete the project and submit the final report to GOCO by March 30, 2020.
- If the project is not closed by its extension date deadline, funds allocated to it may be automatically deauthorized with no further action by the board being necessary.
