The State Board of the Great Outdoors Colorado Trust Fund Resolution 2020-27 November 17, 2020

A Resolution Approving Grants to Resilient Communities Program Projects

This Resolution is made in view of the following facts:

- 1. GOCO created the Resilient Communities Program in response to the unprecedented impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, releasing a Request for Proposals on July 1, 2020;
- 2. The board allocated \$9,570,247 in open space purpose funding and \$5,480,000 in local government purpose funding to this program in its FY21 spending plan;
- 3. During the third Resilient Communities Program grant cycle, GOCO received 48 proposals requesting \$17,500,386.33 in GOCO funding;
- 4. At the June 29, 2020 Programs Committee meeting of the whole board, the board authorized the Programs Committee to make funding decisions on its behalf under the Resilient Communities Program;

Accordingly, the committee RESOLVES to:

- 1. Award \$6,935,509.40 to fully fund 18 projects and partially fund three projects recommended for funding as shown in the attached "Resilient Communities Funding Summary List."
- 2. Finance these awards with an allocation of \$4,933,825.26 from the Open Space purpose and \$2,001,684.14 in Local Government purpose funding.
- 3. Make the award for the Forest Stewards Guild's project contingent upon the Larimer County serving as the applicant.
- 4. Authorize the executive director to make minor adjustments in recommended funding levels if a project cannot proceed as anticipated. In the event significant funding changes are necessary as these projects progress, the executive director will consult with the board for additional direction.
